Pastor's Message

The readings for the Tenth Sunday [B] in Ordinary Time, give the name “sin” to our offenses against God. When we sin -- violate His Commandments -- we distance ourselves from Him; when we refuse, or fear, to admit our sins, we deny ourselves God's freely offered pardon and forgiveness. In describing Adam and Eve's first sin, disobedience, our first reading, taken from Genesis, explains the beginning of evil in the world with its destructive results. The loving relationship joining man to God is destroyed, and the relationship of mutual love between Adam and Eve is weakened. Their default to a “blame game” allowed each to avoid taking personal responsibility for their joint choice

Making Disciples Formation Life Cycle

Connect – The most natural “first step” for most people is to connect with people. Most of us are likely to persevere through a process if we have others walking with us through the process.

Encounter – A life changing encounter with Jesus Christ. It is the energy that inspires us to move through the process.

Conversion – Engaging our will to say “yes” or “no” to those things that foster or threaten my relationship with Jesus Christ.

Grow – Grounding our relationship with God so that we are anchored in relationship regardless of emotion. Learning more about the Bible, the Church’s teachings, and the Cardinal virtues.

Mission – Learning more about the charisms and my charisms. Being equipped for the mission of evangelizing others. Serving the mission within my vocation, within my marriage and family, as well as at work, at my church parish and within the larger community.

ENCOUNTER

"Being Christian is not the result of an ethical choice or a lofty idea, but the encounter with an event, a person, which gives life a new horizon and a decisive direction."
Pope Benedict **XVI**, *God is Love*

Encounter is a life changing encounter with Jesus Christ. It is the energy that inspires us to move through the process. The aim with "encounter" is for the parish to become "architects of encounter." This means helping nurture an environment in which a person has the opportunity to encounter the living God personally.

Encounter awakens a person to the reality of the beauty of Jesus Christ and His personal love.

Each time we receive the sacraments we encounter the presence of God.

Other than through the Sacraments, do we as a parish offer opportunities or an environment for people to have an “encounter” with the living God personally?

An example of **Encounter** would be, while participating in a Bible study (**Grow**), I deepen my relationship with others (**Connect**) and experience God’s presence (**Encounter**) in the truth of the study.

Listed below are a few things to consider when thinking about Encounter.

Have people in our parish moved from "talking about God" to sharing about a concrete, personal experience of God?

We may hear things like: "God felt so real, so near to me" ... "I now know God is real" ... or "Because of this opportunity, I felt His presence". In other words, are people able share an account of experiencing God in a personal and real way?

Are we as a parish offering opportunities for people to experience the presence of God because of the atmosphere created by a prayer opportunity or because of what was done in the prayer opportunity (talk or teaching given, prayer experience that was facilitated)? In other words, without that prayer opportunity, or what it provided, there is no real evidence that the encounter would have happened.

Are people able to move from a general experience to recognizing that it was something meant for them personally?
