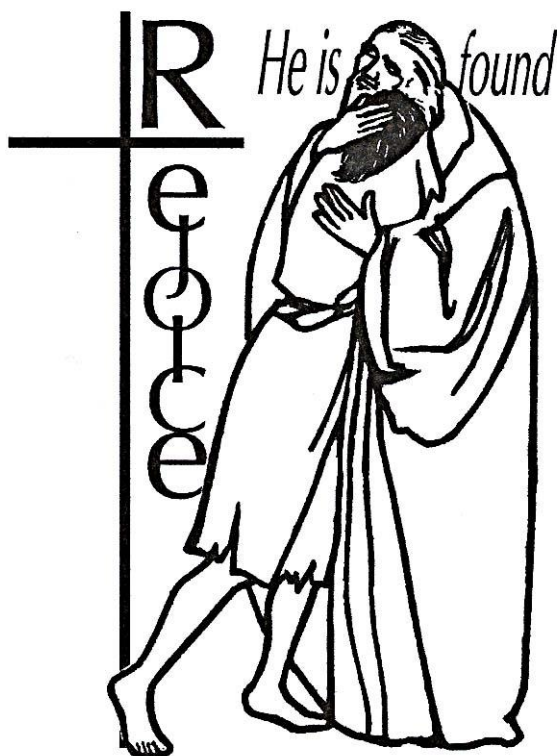

Pastor's Message

This can be for us a Sunday of self-reflection, assessment and correction. If we have been in sin, God, in His mercy, is ready to receive and welcome us back, no less than Jesus welcomed sinners in his time. Let us pray today for God's help in allowing His love and forgiveness into our lives. Let us also ask God for the courage to extend this forgiveness to others who have offended us. As forgiven prodigals, we must be forgiving people. As we continue with the celebration of the Holy Mass, let us pray also for God's Divine mercy on all of us who have fallen away from grace. May our ears be opened so that we may hear that Jesus is welcoming us back home!

Let us confess our sins and regain peace and God's friendship. The first condition for experiencing the joy and relief of having our sins forgiven is to see our sins as they are and give them up. Let us ask for a fresh anointing of the Holy Spirit every morning so that we may do the will of God, and let us conclude every day by asking God's pardon and forgiveness for our sins of the day, resolving to receive the Sacrament of Reconciliation if we are in serious sin. Let us also realize the truth that our brothers and sisters deserve and expect from us the same compassion, kindness and forgiveness which we receive from God.

Twenty Fourth Sunday of Ordinary Time

Luke 15:1-32

While his son was still a long way off, his father caught sight of him, and was filled with compassion."

We can imagine the chuckles and snickers among the crowd when Jesus told the story of the Jewish father who gave half his property to his younger son. Jesus and all who heard him knew the improbability of a Jewish father, then or now, giving his younger son half of his property, then welcoming him back with love. Jesus used this story to teach important lessons. First, God loves us unconditionally. Nothing we can do or fail to do will stop God from loving us. God does not abandon us. Second, it is very difficult for us to love unconditionally. We place conditions on our love in the form of expectations, even if it is to be loved in return. When people we love disappoint us we may love them less or not at all. But Jesus challenged the people of his day, and us, to love unconditionally. Such love is hard for us, and can be hard on those we love. Sometimes we must correct or discipline those we love for their benefit and the benefit of others. How do we love? Do we love unconditionally? If no, will we try harder?

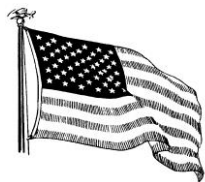
Christian “Son”rise Music Fest

Moments of Mercy -- September 2016

New situations can be intimidating, yet they are also a great opportunity to grow and express yourself. We want to make a good impression on others, whether it is at the beginning of a new school year, a new job, or just meeting someone for the first time. Likewise, when people are first turning to the Christian faith, we want them to have a positive experience of Christianity so that they can come to know the love and mercy of God. In all of our actions then, we ought to take this into consideration and model our own attitudes and actions after Christ, who is the "face of the Father's mercy" (MV, no. 1). 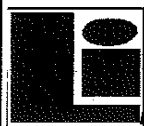

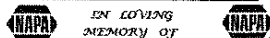
